One plant is capable of releasing hundreds of seeds.

Weed Needs

Early Detection; Rapid Response!

One of the most effective ways to stop the spread of invasive species is to find and control new populations before they become established. Researchers from UW-Madison, Colorado State University, and USGS have worked together to develop early detection maps for the state of Wisconsin. These maps can help any land manager prioritize their invasive species monitoring and control efforts to use their limited resources in the most effective way. You can be a part of this research project by lending your time to this project that seeks to ground truth these early detection maps.
